

News Update



ASEAN Transport Ministers Meeting & Senior Transport Officials Meeting

The 24th ASEAN Transport Ministers Meeting was held on 8 November 2018 in Bangkok, Thailand. H. E. General Prayut Chan-o-cha (Ret.), Prime Minister of Thailand, officially opened the Meeting, while H.E. Mr. Arkhom Termpittayapaisith, Minister of Transport chaired the Meeting with H.E. Mr. Nguen Van The, Minister of Transport of Vietnam, serving as Vice-Chairman. The Meeting was preceded by the 46th ASEAN Senior Transport Officials Meeting (STOM) in which Mr. Somnuk Rongthong, AEROTHAI's President, participated.



In the opening address, the Prime Minister emphasized the collaboration in transportation as essential element in achieving economic growth and contributing to greater sustainable competitiveness for ASEAN countries. Cooperation in transportation will support movements of raw materials and manpower and facilitate trade and investment. The Prime Minister stressed that the implementation of ASEAN Air Traffic Management (ATM) Master Plan will enhance ATM safety, efficiency and capacity in the region, and advance the Seamless ASEAN Sky. Moreover, the Ministers of Transports of ASEAN countries signed the "Protocol 4 on Co-Terminal Rights between Points within the Territory of Any Other ASEAN Member States," which will allow an airline to serve two or more points in another ASEAN Member State on the same flight routing.



Mr. Somnuk Rongthong, AEROTHAI's President said; "This was my pleasure and honor to join the vital event of ASEAN and found that ASEAN members are working closely towards further liberalization of economic key accelerator and removing limitation on air services under the ASEAN Single Aviation Market. ASEAN has continually worked with ASEAN partners, especially for technical element of ASEAN ATM Master Plan and supported aeronautical information sharing."

Aviation Customer Meeting (ACM) 2018

AEROTHAI, in cooperation with Rockwell Collins, USA and Aviation Data Communication Corporation (ADCC), the People's Republic of China hosted the Aviation Customer Meeting (ACM) 2018 entitled "Digital Transformation in a Fully Connected Aviation Ecosystem" during 13 – 14 November 2018 at Grand Ballroom, Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort & Spa, Phuket, Thailand. The ACM 2018 was presided by Mr. Somnuk Rongthong, AEROTHAI's President, Mr. Li Qiguo, Deputy Director General, Air Traffic Management Bureau (ATMB), and Mr. Mike DiGeorge, Vice President, Commercial Aviation & Networks, Information Services, Rockwell Collins.

ACM 2018 was organized by the three organizations that co-host Airline Operational Communications (AOC) in Asia and the Pacific, namely "GLOBALink Asia". Throughout the two-day meeting the participants were able to articulate important next steps for servicing, operationalizing, identifying and agreeing on future activities, and developing some action plans for future activities.
