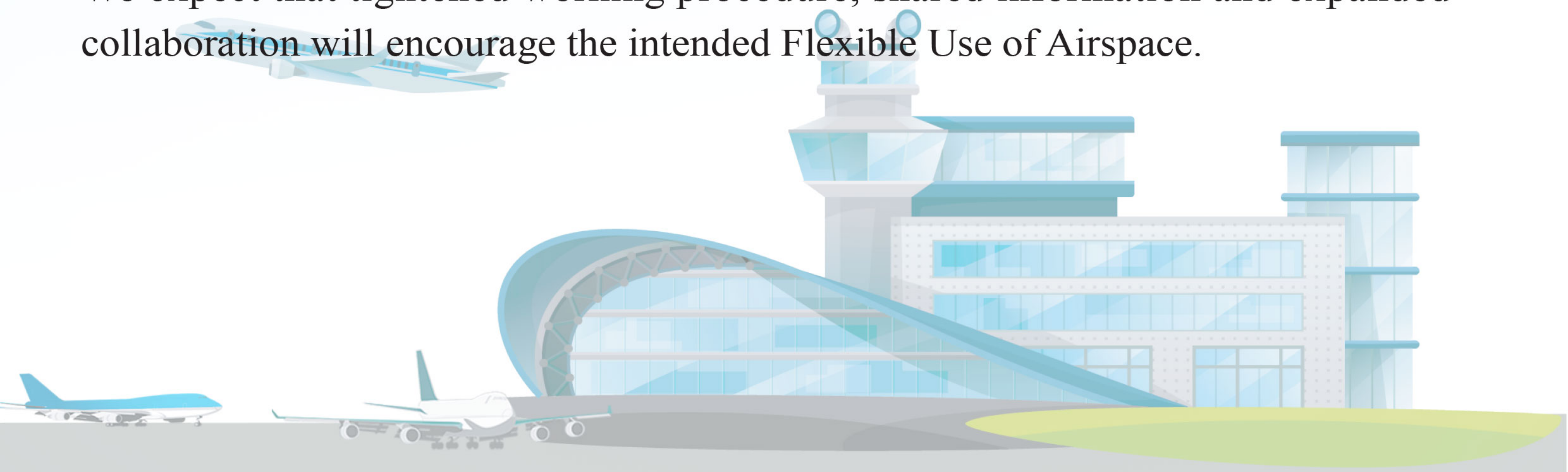

AEROTHAI cooperated with GlobaLink Partners to provide Flight and Tarmac Solutions

The President of AEROTHAI, Mr. Somnuk Rongthong, Mr. Li Qui Guo, Deputy Director General, Air Traffic Management Bureau (ATMB), under Civil Aviation Administration of China (CAAC), Dr. Zhu Yan Bo, Vice President of Aviation Data Communication Corporation (ADCC) and Ms. Clotile Enel-Rehel, General Manager, Commercial Aviation & Network Services, Avionics, Collins Aerospace, USA, jointly chaired 3-way GlobaLink Asia Partners Meeting in Singapore on 10 December 2019, to enhance service quality and business opportunity.

The President said; “This meeting was held by 3 parties which are airline data communications service providers in the Asia and Pacific region for over 20 years. Its objectives are to determine strategic plan in the airline data network services, to find optimal solutions for the users, and to provide the most effective service which keeps pace with current and future aviation communication technology.”



The President added; “Moreover, all 3 partners mutual agreed and signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Flight and Tarmac Solutions. This solution is to provide products and support services to all interested parties in ground and air operations by offering modern communication systems for aviation community along with the effective exchange of information to increase safety and efficiency. It is the first time the 3 parties will extend the services to go beyond air-to-ground communications, combining legacy systems with new enhancements to create collaborative decision-making environment.”





Recent Activity

AEROTHAI and Royal Thai Air Force tightened cooperation on Airspace Management

President of AEROTHAI, Mr. Somnuk Rongthong and the Royal Thai Air force (RTAF) Commander ACM Maanat Wongwat signed the revised version of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to intensify strategic partnership on 26 December 2019.

The overall objective of this MoU is to establish policy and cooperation on Airspace Management that will facilitate AEROTHAI and RTAF in determine responsibilities and explore common guidelines to integrate procedures.

AEROTHAI and RTAF have long-standing cooperation, while the Provisional Directorate of Civil/Military Air Traffic Management Coordination or P-DCMAC was developed to strengthen the cooperation on Airspace Management in terms of strategic, pre-tactical and tactical level.



AEROTHAI's President said; "Under the MoU, both sides agree to enhance cooperation on ATM and ATM training by undertaking exchange of information and personnel which would result in the strengthening of people-to-people connection and collaboration."

The MoU demonstrates RTAF and AEROTHAI's commitment to their cooperation on Strategic Airspace Management, especially in terms of Flexible Use of Airspace, prosperity and security in Airspace Management as part of the Asia-Pacific region. Pre-tactical Airspace Management including the discussion in conditional route, and strategic procedures. This MoU also expresses mutual goodwill and the shared goal of furthering concrete cooperation in Tactical Airspace Management. Both sides agree to enhance cooperation in professional training by undertaking the exchange of experts, experiences, and best practices."
